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Benjamin T'sou's Biography

Benjamin K. T'sou is Chair Professor of Linguistics & Asian Languages, and Director, Language Information Sciences Research Centre of the City University of Hong Kong. He did his MA at Harvard University and Phd at U.C. Berkeley. He worked under Victor Yngve on Chinese-English MT at M.I.T. Since 1995 he has cultivated and dynamically maintained the largest synchronous corpus of Chinese, LIVAC, [to date 250 million characters with a 1.2million word lexical database: <http://livac.org>] which has enabled him to pursue NLP interests beyond resource cultivation, such as automatic summarization, sentiment analysis, STT, Chinese-English bilingual text alignment and cross-lingual retrieval, and more recently Chinese patent language. He is the founding President of the Asian Federation of NLP and a Standing Committee member of the Executive Board of the Chinese Information Processing Society of China. He serves on the editorial boards of a number of national and international publications on Chinese linguistics, and on computational linguistics, and is now a member of the Royal Academy of Overseas Sciences of Belgium.
