



## **Eric GAUSSIER'S Biography**

**Eric Gaussier** received his PhD in Computer Science from University Paris in 1995 for work on bilingual lexicon extraction from parallel corpora. After a year spent in the linguistics department of Université Paris as research assistant (Attaché Temporaire d'Enseignement et de Recherché), he joined the Xerox Research Centre Europe (XRCE) in 1996, to work on textual indexing for information retrieval. He then led a research team on textual information access, and later became area manager of the group Learning and Content Analysis of XRCE. He joined the University Joseph Fourier as a Professor, and the Grenoble Computer Science Laboratory (LIG), in September 2006. He is currently conducting research on machine learning for information access. Besides several publications and projects on computational linguistics, information retrieval and machine learning, Eric Gaussier was a member of the editorial board of Corpus Linguistics and Computational Linguistics, and currently serves on the Executive Board of the European Association for Computational Linguistics and on the Information Science panel of the European Research Consortium.
